## A GRIEVING MOM'S REQUEST

A year after the death of her daughter, a grieving mom writes to family and friends:

"There are no appropriate words; nothing you can say that will make it better. But your calls, your visits, your invitations mean a lot to me. They remind me I am still alive and still have a life outside this tragedy.

"I cry a lot, and I am OK with that. I'm not embarrassed about it, and you shouldn't be, either. Don't suggest that I take medication. I'm entitled to my emotions. I need to feel, to grieve. I want to talk about my daughter. I want to say her name and hear her name, and if I cry, it's OK. Please don't avoid talking to me because you don't want to upset me. I will cry either alone or in front of you, and I don't want you to feel uncomfortable or guilty.

"If what you tell me is true, that you think of me all the time, please call me or send me an e-mail. Don't wait for that random grocery-aisle meeting to tell me how much I am on your mind . . . My loss is not contagious. You shouldn't be scared to be with me. Any discomfort you initially feel should subside if you give it a chance and give me a chance. If you are planning an evening out, a lunch date, a getaway, please make an effort to include me. I often feel like a pariah. My intention is not to 'bring you down,' and I do my best not to burden anyone with my sadness. Don't feel awkward inviting me to have some 'fun,' and don't assume I won't join in, so why even bother asking. I may often decline, but it is comforting to be included. Being excluded is killing me . . .

"If you see my kids, don't just ask them how I am doing; please ask them how they are doing. They lost their older sister, their confidante, their best friend, and need to know that people are concerned about them, too. This loss happened to my whole family - all of us.

"I realized this past year, after the last meal was dropped off, the last card arrived, and the official visits were over, everyone's lives resumed, except for ours. Yes, we go through the motions, smiling, working, shopping, nodding, and telling people we are fine. But deep inside there is that void, that constant ache that will always be there, as it should be, and that is all right with me."

† **In today's Gospel, Jesus encounters the widow of Nain who is burying her son and, Luke writes, "was moved with pity" for her. While we feel the**

**heartbreak for survivors like the widow and the mom grieving for her daughter, we don't know what to do or say and so we avoid them. But in her letter to her family and friends, this grieving mother offers all of us a lesson in compassion. While we cannot restore their loved ones to life as Jesus does in today's Gospel, we can restore the grieving to life - we can help them cross the bridge from their isolating grief to being part of the community again. It does not require an understanding of the psychology of grief; it begins with loving and caring enough to call, to invite, to inquire, to offer. There are no words that will make it better - we can only offer the compassion that is of God that heals and restores in its own good time. †**

## **THE BOSNIAN EXPERIENCE**

You are invited to celebrate the beginning of summer with Lindenwood Area Senior Ministry and a day trip called *The Bosnian Experience!* Joe DeGregorio will show us around the Bosnian-American neighborhood and cultural center in the Bevo Mill area. Many still remember the circumstances that brought these war refugees to America and the assistance the United States provided them to resettle here. The St. Louis contingent now numbers between 60,000 and 70,000, the largest group of "Bosniaks" outside of Bosnia-Herzegovina. Many refugees in other American cities moved to St. Louis in the last 15 years mainly because of the strong ethnic community that was established in the old German neighborhood. Many of us have ancestors who left repressive environments and endured many hardships to migrate here and these war refugees from the former Yugoslavia are no exception.

Be prepared to truly experience Eastern Europe for a day, without the need for a passport! We'll hear many stories of war experience, migration and settlement in St. Louis. We'll tour the Islamic Community Center Mosque. Lunch will be at Grbics restaurant, a Central and Eastern European style gathering place, on the site of the old Baily's Farm Dairy. During lunch we'll enjoy a mini-concert by Edo, a professional accordion player and singer. We'll also have time for some local shopping.
